Description

Contact calls are based on the COUR-ii....COUR-ii... call and are used when a bird is searching for other curlew. They are heard throughout the year and are intentionally loud when they are made in flight.

They are also used quietly, on the ground to keep track on the chicks.



The plaintive buuuuuuuuuuuuu at the end of a contact call can also be heard when a male is enticing the female to nest.

ADULT-CHICK CONTACT CALLS can be heard when adults are keeping track of roaming chicks. Usually a short contact call can be heard followed by the chick's piping response, as in the audio clip.
